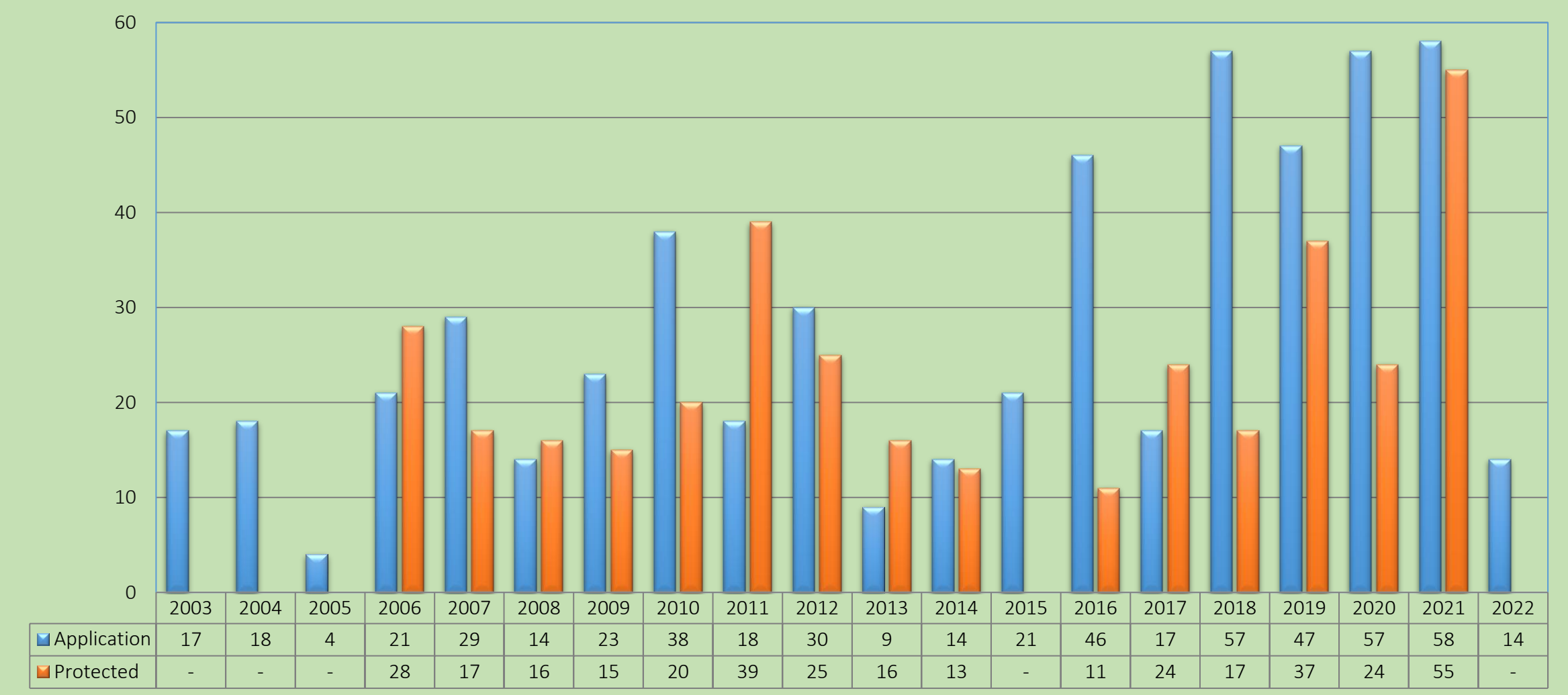

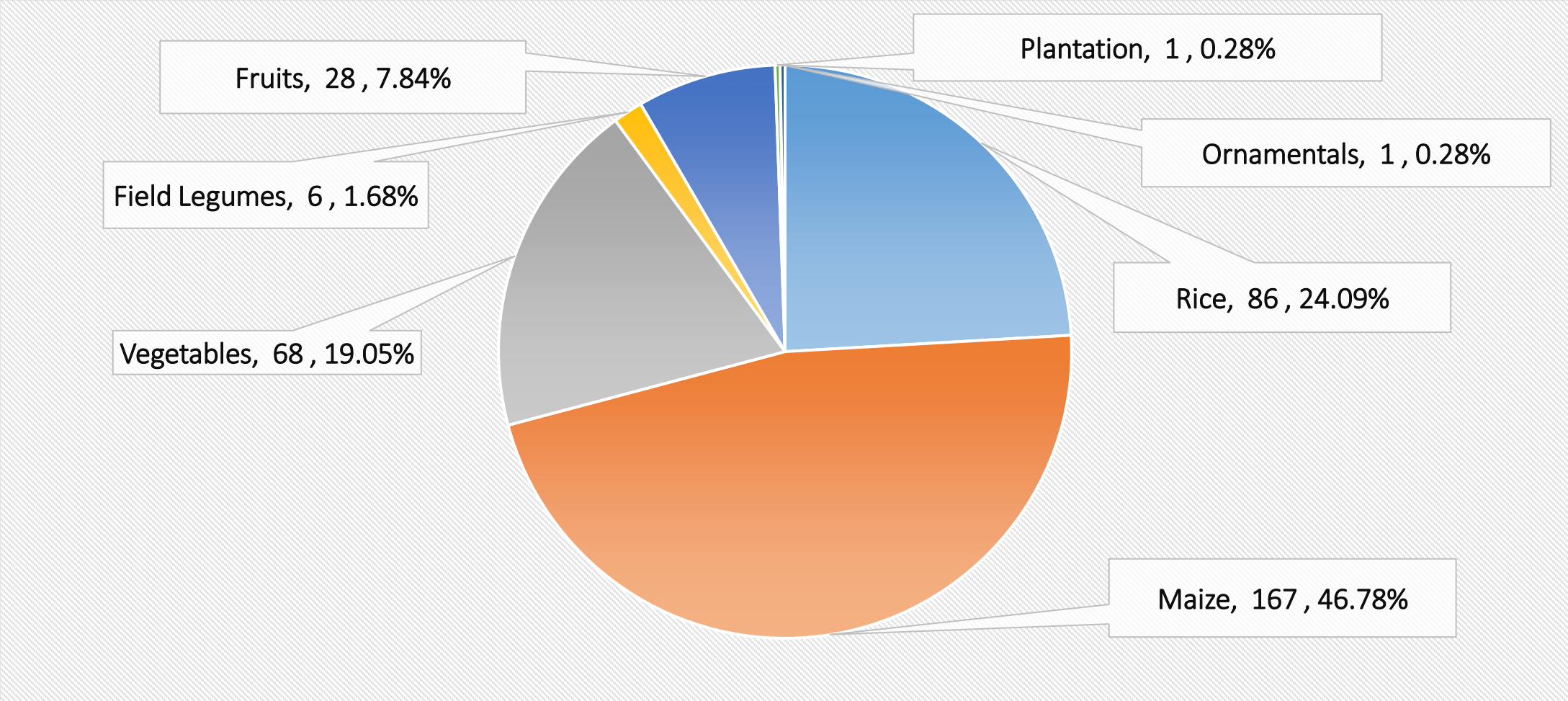

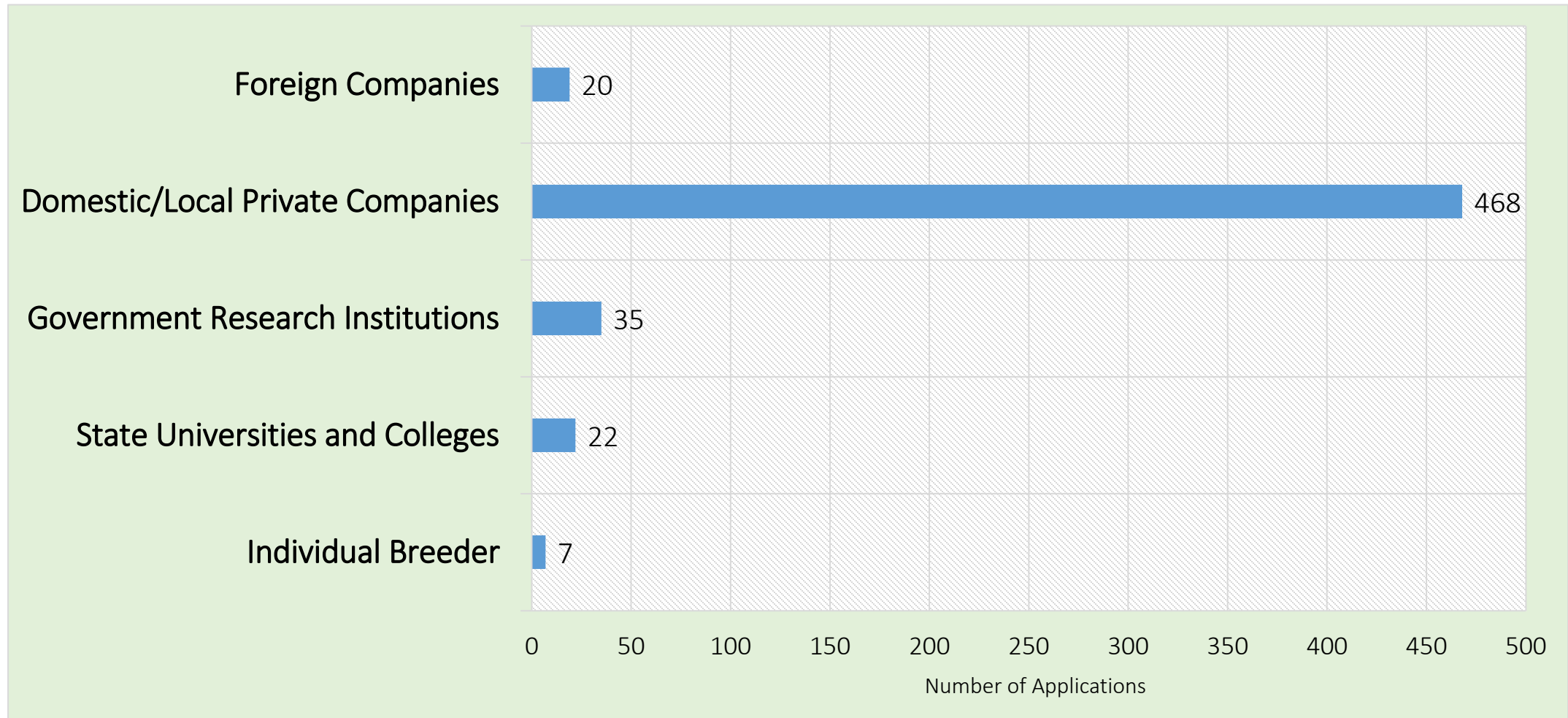
Breakdown of Protected Plant Varieties
