





- Lack of PVP procedure and DUS test guideline for some potential crops aligned with UPOV guideline,

Movement toward UPOV membership (for non-UPOV member)

Things have done:

- 1. Request a review from UPOV for Indonesia's Plant Variety Protection (PVP) Law (Law No. 29 of 2000), which was conducted in 2009.
- 2. "Benefit and cost assessment" conducted by IPB University in 2021.
- 3. Review by the Ministry of Law and Human Rights in 2022, leading to recommendations for legal amendments.
- 4. Cooperation with Ipkey south east asia seminar on PVP and UPOV 1991 act
- 5. Government initiative on hold due to elections in 2024.
- 6. Amending the PVP law is not yet a priority for the Ministry of Agriculture for 2024.

What to do next

- 1. Propose for full law analysis about "The Impact of PVP Nasional Law"
- 2. Propose again in 2025 for the amendment of the Plant Variety Protection (PVP) Law, while also discussing the potential harmonization with the UPOV 1991 Act."

















Key similarities and differences from UPOV

Similarities of PVP law no 29/2000 with UPOV Act 1991:

- 1. Scope of protection all species and genera
- 2. Main requirement for protection:
 - a. Novelty, Distinctness, Uniformity, and Stability
 - b. Denomination
- 3. Duration of protection: Indonesia PVP law states the duration of protection 20 years (annual plant) and 25 years (perennial plants)
- 4. End of protection:
 - a. Cancellation
 - b. Nullity











Difference of PVP law no 29/2000 with UPOV Act 1991

- ✓ Several article ask to be deleted with some reason:
- ✓ Need adjustment sentences/texts that are not in line with the UPOV 1991 Convention.
- ✓ Need Addition of sentences/texts/clauses.
- ✓ Requested to be included in the lower implementing regulations
- ✓ Article are unclear and Further clarification is needed.
- ✓ Some article suggested to be state in other (separate) Law ex. Local variety issue
- ✓ Additional articles that are not yet included in Law 29/2000 are required.
