Mission: to provide and promote an effective system of plant variety protection, with the aim of encouraging the development of new varieties of plants, for the benefit of society




UPOV STATUS – 79th member: Armenia March 2, 2024 States that requested comments on [Draft] Laws (2020-2024)






Total applications filed, titles issued and titles in force

UPOV

Essentially Derived Varieties (EDV)

- On 30 October 2019 the CAJ decided to open up the explanatory notes for essentially derived varieties (UPOV/EXN/EDV/2) for revision.
- On 27 October 2023 the UPOV Council adopted new explanatory notes, UPOV/EXN/EDV/3

- the Council agreed to add as a standing item on the CAJ agenda "Updates from UPOV members and observers relating to the implementation of the concept of essentially derived varieties"

Harvested material (WG-HRV)

Conclusions of the fifth meeting of the WG-HRV - March 2024

- The members of the WG-HRV expressed support for commissioning a study.
- Some initial initiatives and ideas on how to fund the study had been identified but that matter should be further explored.

At a virtual meeting in May 2024 with a subgroup of the WG-HRV a joint proposal was agreed on the number and names of authors and the matters relating to funding for consideration by the WG-HRV at its sixth meeting in October 2024

Discussions on the proposals to revise the Explanatory Notes on Provisional Protection under the UPOV Convention will be put on UPOV hold until progress was made on matters concerning the study.

WG-SHF

Replies to a survey for consideration by the WG-SHF – in October 2024

 Survey on the implementation by UPOV members of the exception "acts done privately and for non-commercial purposes"

The vast majority of responding countries did not identify any specific challenges or opportunities in implementing this exception

Some members reported on challenges and opportunities in implementing the optional exemption (Article 15.2 of the 1991-Act of the UPOV Convention), which was not the subject of the survey.

Some responses highlighted that there is a challenge to establish the difference between small holder farmers and subsistence farmers




