INDIVIDUAL IMPLEMENTING STRATEGY OF MYANMAR

prepared by Myanmar

1. National goal (for next 10 years: 2018 to 2027)

- Intend to enforce the 2019 New Plant Variety Protection Law with articles which are in line with UPOV 1991 act.
- ii. Intend to become UPOV member as a foundation of encouraging the development of new plant varieties for all stakeholders of the regime to contribute for developing sustainable agriculture and achieving food security.
- iii. To Enhance regional harmonization on application, examination and granting procedures towards the effective and cooperative PVP system for the breeders in the region and globally in future.

2. Objectives with analysis of challenges (for next 3 years)

2025

- i. To conduct targeted workshops and media campaigns to educate farmers, breeders, and policymakers on the benefits of PVP and UPOV membership.

2027

- v. To establish a PVP stakeholder network (breeders, NGOs, seed companies) to monitor system effectiveness.

- Awareness: Conduct regional workshops on PVP benefits, targeting seed industry stakeholders.
- Online System: Pilot the e-filing portal for PVP applications with IT support from EAPVP partners.
- Database Development: Collaborate with regional members to create a shared application and reference variety database system

For 2027

- Training: Organize/Attend DUS test training for examiners with support from UPOV/EAPVP experts.
- Awareness: Conduct regional workshops on PVP benefits, targeting seed industry stakeholders.
- Online System: Pilot the e-filing portal for PVP applications with IT support from EAPVP partners.

- Database Development: Collaborate with regional members to create a shared application and reference variety database system
